## MINUTES OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

### Siouxland Libraries

Downtown Library

Wednesday, March 8, 2023 – 4:30 p.m.

1. Roll Call and declaration of quorum. The meeting was called to order at 4:30 PM by Hogstad. Members present: Adam Emerson, Lorie Hogstad, Anne Land, Justine Murtha, Joel Rosenthal, and Library Director Jodi Fick. Members absent: County Commissioner Dean Karsky  
Staff present: Alysia Boysen, Bri Schreurs, Amy Larsen, and Monique Christensen
2. Adoption of the agenda. Motion by Emerson and second by Murtha to adopt the agenda. Motion carried.
3. Motion by Emerson and second by Land to approve the minutes of the January 11, 2023 regular meeting. Motion carried.
4. Motion by Rosenthal and second by Land to approve the minutes of the February 8, 2023 special meeting. Motion carried.
5. Review of financial and statistical reports. Financial: 12.6% operating budget used with 16% of the year completed. Statistical: Small decrease in number of active cards and an increase in new card registration. Library hours open decreased due to weather related closures in January and February. Check outs of physical items is up 2.8%; digital items are up 25%; overall circulation is up 7.5%. ILL up 3.7% borrowed is what we receive from other libraries, loan is loaned to other libraries. We borrow things that don't fit our criteria to add to our collection or that we no longer own. Movies and audiobook lending and borrowing increased the use of ILL. Justine asked about the big increases at Hartford and Humboldt along with noting that ValleySprings use is low. Last month the Senior Admin team met with Rural East staff to brainstorm how to improve use of the Valley Springs branch. Meeting rooms, study rooms, computer use all up. Computers and also up with the increased reliability of the new computer management software. Program attendance also continues to increase. It was noted that programs that are above capacity may affect the quality of the program for the attendees.
6. Library Director and staff reports.
  - a. Director Report - Ronning carpeting project is almost done; vendor ran out of carpeting during February installation and will install after hours once carpet arrives. Strategic plan will be presented to the City Council at the Informational session on April 11 at 4 p.m. Monique reported that the Automated Materials Handling units are being installed this week and next. Bri Schreurs, Communication Strategist for library presented the Communication Strategy Plan for 2023. It focuses on three areas: Customer growth and retention, Early literacy, and Promotion of specific services including JobNow and LinkedIn Learning. Bookmobile is almost ready to go back on the road with repairs nearly completed from the accident last fall. There was significant body damage, delays in getting the materials, and delays in getting scheduled with the body shop. Staff have been providing limited services to the affected bookmobile stops and have some special activities planned to celebrate the bookmobile being back in service. Library submitted their FTE position requests for next 5 years; these will be considered along with the needs of other city departments. We are working on the 2024 budget request. Rosenthal asked about the materials budget and if it has been able to keep up with inflation. Fick responded that inflation and growth has definitely had an impact. We've done a number of things to help such

as floating collections, faster filling of holds, and courier. We have also been able to add some to the materials budget with increased county funding.

- b. One Book Siouxland update – Amy Larsen provided an update on the events planned around Accidental Rancher by Eliza Blue. Blue is a musician and the book highlights her journey in learning to live on a ranch in western South Dakota. April 1 kickoff is a Sustainability expo booths information and give aways, special tea blend. Farm Her display -women farming in SD, Kids activities in Children’s area. April 11 RO pioneer experience pioneer gear, butter, wash gclothes April 15 Allen and Jill hisotyr of traditional western music. April 19 kick-off of the Common Roots seed library, classes every month. April 22 Old Clourthouse museum Eliza author talk and music. Room for 200 – 150 signed up already. Coloring pages, stamp your quilt passport – Bethany prairie photographs. Drawing for art prints. Tea and spice exchange. 30 kits for bookclubs to get tea and cookie sets.
  - c. Everybody Reads update – Fick reported on Everybody Reads. The program runs March 13 – 31, and is a joint project between Siouxland Libraries and the Sioux Falls School District. This is the second year for the program, and the goal is to encourage reading – especially at the schools by showing kids that “Everybody Reads!” An added element is donations to REACH literacy for every 100,000 books read, up to 300,000. People can get their books added to the total both at the libraries or online.
7. Public Input. (There was no public input.)
  8. Unfinished Business. (There was no unfinished business.)
  9. New Business. To approve the Interlibrary Loan Policy. Alysia Boysen reviewed the policy which defines specifics related to borrowing items from other libraries for Siouxland patrons and loaning items to other libraries.

  12. Adjournment. The meeting was adjourned at 5:36 P.M.

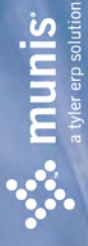
