Pedestrian Plan – continue to look at priority items each month and discuss implementation strategies:

Utilize curb extension, median, and pedestrian refuge islands more frequently to help limit the crossing distance for pedestrians.

e.g. Minnesota Ave. median; 41st St. & I-29 Interchange.

How are elements considered, are they designed?

Committee should polish these items and/or prioritize them to ATB.

Complete Streets review. Since 2015, The planning and design of street projects will give due consideration to bicycle, pedestrian, and transit facilities from the very start of planning and design work for roadway projects – pavement preservation, high safety risk excessive costs are issues.

Order in sidewalks. Inventory of streets that have missing sidewalk; design work with new projects. Prioritize the missing sidewalks, and list them for ATB.
